Home Front Food

Research a recipe from the home front during World War Two. Make it! Read some restaurant reviews. Write a review of the meal as if you are a restaurant critic! A photo of the meal would be great too! You could even create a restaurant setting at home as a background for you photo! Be creative!

Make a video or audio report of a news report from the home front during World War Two. It could be about a bombing during the blitz or a positive story to keep up morale. You could involve other members of your family. Or you could write a script for a news report.

Shopping List

Imagine you were housewife during World War Two in Britain. (It would invariably be the woman who was responsible for feeding the family during the 1940's). Try to find out how much the items would cost and which were rationed. How much would you need to buy to feed **your** family for a week? You can record this in any way you want: a shopping list, powerpoint, video or report.



Make a Model

Make a model of something related to World War Two. It could be a fighter plane, an Anderson shelter, a tank, a scene from the home front such as a blitzed house or an allotment, a gas mask, a box of rations.



World War Two Propaganda

Research government posters during World War Two. What were they used for? What subjects did they cover? They became a particular form of art. Design a World War Two poster using one of the subjects and art style.



Do some physical exercise outdoors.

Find a creative way of showing what you did. Demonstrate the short and long term effects of physical exercise. Try to present it in a way that could persuade someone to take more exercise and spend more time outdoors.
