

Arithmetic Paper


- 20 questions
- Covers addition, subtraction, multiplication, division and fractions


Reasoning Paper


- Between 30/35 worded/problem solving questions

- The paper starts off with 5 questions that are verbally read by the teacher



- Counting in 2s, 5s, 10s, 3s, 10 more/less
- Quick spellings

At home...

- Daily reading ask additional questions about the text
- Maths ask the children to explain how they worked something out.
- Spelling -Practice the weekly spellings and go back through previous weeks ones too – can they remember the rule?
- Grammar charades or hangman with a noun/verb/adjective/adverb focus



Remember to <u>NOT</u> mention it to your child – they do not need to know! Don't panic or stress, they will all be absolutely AMAZING!

Support at home

- We have put some work up on Teams to support your child at home as part of the preparation.
- Please keep this very low key with them and have a look at a small section as and when you can.
- Please read daily and update GoRead
 — this is just so important to all aspects of the children's learning.
- Talk through your child's learning. So much learning can happen through the talking and explaining, especially in maths.
