Term-Time Leave of Absence

Changes in the law mean that Headteachers can no longer grant leave of absence in term-time unless there are exceptional circumstances for the absence. The following reasons are NOT considered as exceptional:

- Holidays taken in term time due to lower costs, parental work commitments or once in a life time experiences.
- Holidays abroad for the purpose of visiting a sick relative
- Holidays booked as a surprise by relatives

Parents of children who have regular unauthorised absences or who take their children on holiday during term time may receive a penalty notice and a fine of £60 per parent per child. If this is not paid within 28 days the fine rises to £120. If no payment is made you could face court action.

Being 15 mins late every day will add up to TWO WEEKS of school missed every year!

The Education Act of 1996 states that it is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to ensure that all children between the ages of 5-16 years attend school on a regular basis AND on time.

Failure to do this result in a fine and being taken to court.

Missing days of School adds up. . .

As a parent it is your responsibility to let the school know if your child is going to be absent. Please contact the school on the first day of an absence on 01628 521553. Messages can be left 24hrs a day. Failure to contact the school causes a lot of work for the office and can result in a home visit or social services being contacted.

Unacceptable reasons for absence:

- Shopping
- Birthday treats
- Visiting relatives
- Non-urgent medical and dental appointments

Remember:

The **only** acceptable reasons for non-attendance are:

- Illness
- Emergency appointments
- Interviews/visits to prospective schools

- 12 days EVERY term
- 36 days EVERY year
- 180 days in five years. . .
- ... That's nearly ONE WHOLE SCHOOL YEAR!

Persistent Absence

Any child with an attendance below 90% regardless of the reason for the absence. This equates to just 2 days each month.
